Please prayerfully consider serving on the Board. Encourage someone you know who would be a great board member. A write-in space is included on the ballot for anyone feeling called to serve - and/or to vote for another candidate.

Who knows - perhaps you have had life experiences that put you in a position to serve during a time such as this? You may be the pencil in the hand of our writing God. Is Christ calling YOU to be His hands and feet?
